Oasis Enrichment Center (OEC) After-School Program for youth in grades 2-12; meets Mondays-Thursdays from 2-6:pm in the back end of the Bickford Community Center, 232 Bickford Ave. This is our newest initiative and focuses on empowerment sessions that will focus on the following areas of student health:

- **Academic Health** through tutoring, homework help, research computer lab, intentional career path training, college prep, technical career exposure, and academic progress motivations;
- **Physical Health** through sports recreation and nutritional education;
- **Social/Communal Health** through positive peer interaction, fun fellowship, and diversity training.
- **Emotional Health** through intentional counseling and self-imagining empowerment sessions
- **Life Skill Health** through intentional life skills training sessions including but not limited to job readiness, finance, budgeting, investing, paying bills, credit counseling, taxes, computer literacy, social media etiquette, etc.



Read2Succeed (R2S) for kids in grades 2-5: Students are paired with a coach who will listen to their assigned child read, challenge them with new words & Bible verses, track their progress, and provide lots of encouragement! Meets Mondays and Wednesdays from 4:30-6:00pm.



CLUB 3:16 for kids in grades 6-12: Every teen needs a safe space to have fun and express themselves. They also need to hear how the love of Christ and God's truth relates to their everyday struggles and questions. Club is just that space! We'll have games, entertainment, difficult discussions, and inspiring truth aimed at provoking God-empowered change in the lives of North Memphis teens! Meets Wednesdays from 6:00-8:00pm in the gym.



EntreLeadership Mentoring Programs are where we GO DEEPER! These groups receive more intense leadership training and Christian discipleship growth. Students have Christian professional mentors who are willing to walk with them, in partnership with their parents, through the path of life.

- **Warrior Princesses & Lion's Cage Clubs** for kids in grades 3-5: Students come together to learn life skills such as cooking or self-defense, spiritual development, and community service. Warrior Princesses (girls) and Lion's Cage (boys) meet the 1st & 3rd Saturdays from 10:00am-12:00pm.
- **Pathfinders** for kids in grades 6-8: Middle School can be tough! We tailor a gender and age appropriate Bible study just for tweens where our caring adults provide spiritual development, empowerment, and discipleship. Girls and boys meet separately but both gather on the 1st & 3rd Saturdays from 10am-12pm.
- **LifeBuilders** for kids in grades 9-12: Partnering with Christian professionals, teens need positive role models and 1-on-1 mentors who are willing to invest in their lives and guide them through these challenging years. We provide a safe community where kids can learn about God's Word and how to navigate life's challenges by tapping into the resources around them.

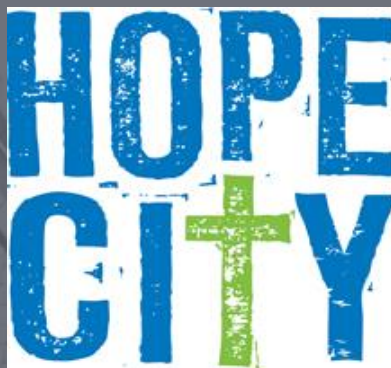
